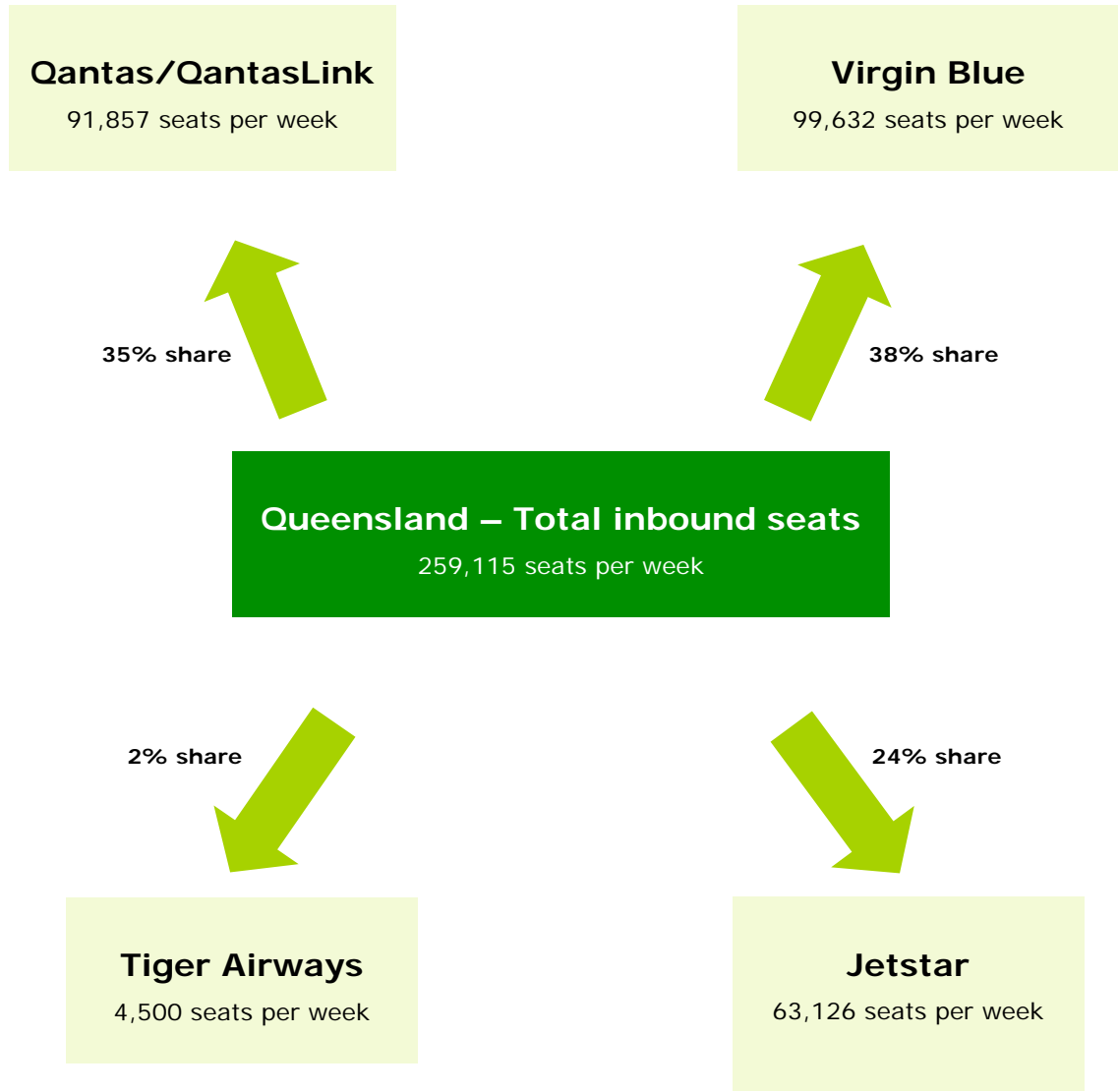

In March 2010, the weekly domestic seat capacity into Queensland destinations is estimated at 259,115 seats.

Capacity into Brisbane, Gold Coast, Cairns and Townsville airports combined accounted for 83% of the total capacity provided to Queensland airports in March 2010.

From 28 March 2010, Brisbane to Launceston Jetstar Airways flight will increase from 4 times weekly to a daily service.

The Perth to Cairns Tiger Airways flight will increase to from 3 to 5 flights weekly from 28 March 2010, while the Adelaide to Cairns flight will increase to 2 new flights a week.

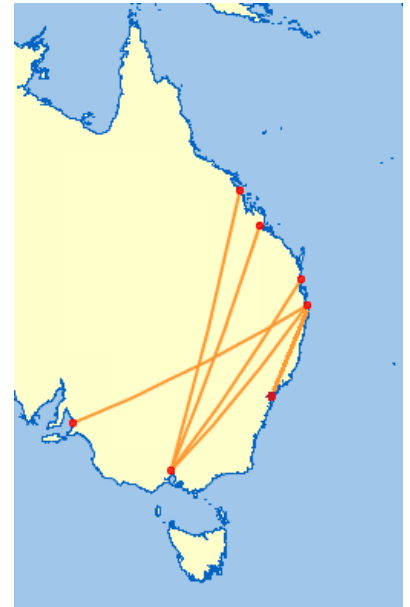

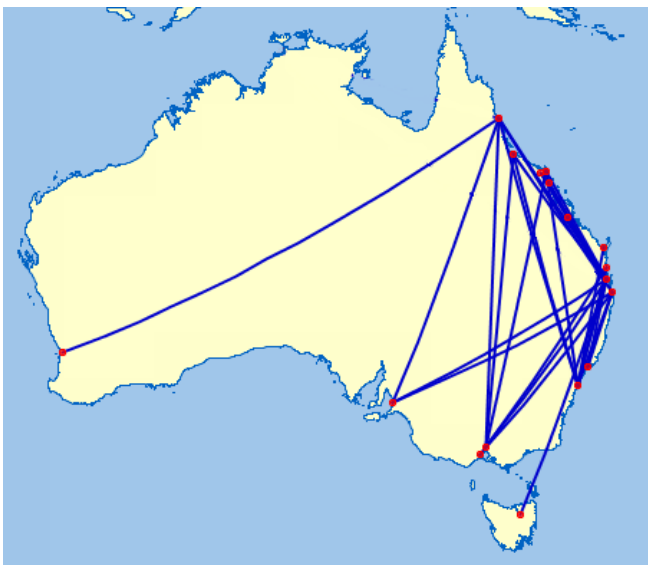
Qantas – Queensland routes
