

There are many ways to experience Queensland on wheels. Take your pick from hire bikes of all types and sizes, horse drawn coach gallops through the Outback, riverside adventures on rollerblades and even the thrills of high speed laps in a race car.

Spyder Riding on the Gold Coast

The Gold Coast is the only place in the world people can ride the unusual and stylish Can Am Spyder Roadster Motorbike. The unusual looking set of wheels offers riders and passengers the speed and thrills of a motorbike with the safety and stability of a car including traction control, stability control, power steering and ABS. The half day 'You-Ryde' tag-along and 'We-Ryde' pillion passenger tours visit places including Springbrook, Mount Tamborine and Surfers Paradise. A valid motorcycle licence and a minimum age of 23 years is required for the You-Ride tour and both include gear hire (helmet, jacket and gloves), morning or afternoon tea, fuel, insurance and guide/s. Thrill Rydes also available. The Spyder can accelerate faster than a Porsche 911. You-Ryde and We-Ryde tours take four hours and Thrill Rides range from 30 minutes to two hours. Harley rides around Southern Queensland

Explore the rainforest on an ATV

Zoom through the rainforest on your own four wheeled motorbike on a Blazing Saddles ATV (all-terrain vehicle) tour near Kuranda. Riders enjoy a safety and introductory lesson, are placed into a group with similar skill levels and the head out on the half day tour with experienced guides. Free transfer services are available from Cairns and the Northern Beaches. The morning tour includes a BBQ lunch at the conclusion of the tour, and the afternoon tour includes light refreshments. Pedalling in Port Douglas

Combine fun and exercise and hire a bike from Port Douglas Bike Hire during your stay in Tropical North Queensland. There are more than 350 bikes to choose from including family options with baby seats, tag-alongs, trailers and tandems. Helmets, locks, visitor and tour information and cycling advice are included and all bikes are adjusted to personally fit customers. Half, full day and longer periods are available. Port Douglas has a number of bike tracks including Macrossan Street and Port Douglas Road, or take your beach gear and head down to Four Mile Beach for ride along the sand. The famous Bump Track, an historic six kilometre track is also a popular destination for mountain bikers. Wheely wonderful ways to see Brisbane City

Riverlife is based on the Brisbane River under the Kangaroo Point cliffs and offers some great ways to see the city on wheels. Hire some rollerblades for a few hours, or the whole day, and skate along the river to South Bank. Skate hire includes all equipment including a helmet, K2 rollerblades, and protective knee, elbow and wrist pads. Cycles are also available, and for something different try a Kick Bike, a bicycle-scooter hybrid which is a great alternative for those a little unstable on a traditional bike. When the exercise is over consider a more relaxed way of seeing the city – from the comfort of a gondola on the Wheel of Brisbane at South Bank Parklands. It stands 60 metres tall and has 42 air-conditioned capsules, each with seating for up to six adults and two children. Motorsport legend remembered in Yeppoon

Champions Brock Experience at Yeppoon near Rockhampton is a tribute to Australian icon, the late Peter Brock. Displayed in a unique setting and featuring some 38 vehicles and a vast array of personal and professional memorabilia, the Experience is a fitting tribute to motorsport legend Peter Brock who died tragically in 2006. The collection has come together over 15 years and the museum was nearly five years in the making. Visitors can also participate in a sound and light show which runs once daily and features unique audio and video footage not seen anywhere else in the world. Segway tours in Southern Queensland

Two Southern Queensland beach resorts have added Segway tours to their guest activity line-up. Couran Cove Island Resort on South Stradbroke Island off the Gold Coast and Novotel Twin Waters Resort on the Sunshine Coast are offering guests the chance to experience the fun of these two-wheeled electric personal transporters that can reach off-road speeds of up to 20kmh. Couran's Segway tours travel through the resort and island's bushland, rainforests and then on to the boardwalk through the sand dunes to 22km of pristine white beach. Mini Moking around Magnetic

The cute, four-wheel drives known as "mini mokes" are as much a feature of beautiful Magnetic Island as the bays, beaches and headlands of this scenic destination. Magnetic is an easy 25 minute cruise across the bay from Townsville and the mokes are an ideal way for visitors to explore the island. Moke Magnetic have been hiring these vehicles on the island since 1986 and now run a fleet of 65 vehicles. The year round sunshine and laid-back atmosphere of the island means the mokes are perfect way to get around, and hirers can travel at their own pace. Explore the Outback by horse-drawn wagon

Experience the history of Australia's famous Cobb & Co stagecoaches in Longreach in Queensland's Outback. Back in the 19th century Cobb & Co transported passengers, parcels and mail on their coaches to every mainland colony and Longreach was a major hub in Queensland. The half day Gallop Thru the Scrub tour begins when the driver blows his bugle to mark the departure of the stagecoach. As you gallop along seeing local wildlife including kangaroos and beautiful Brolga birds, he will tell you the history of Cobb and Co and Longreach. The overnight tour, Clancy's Campoput, includes riverside camping under the stars in a luxury swag, three course Silver Service camp oven dinner by candlelight, bush yarns, poetry and ballads by the camp fire. www.kinnonandco.com.au

Eco-Bikes offer new way to explore the Gold Coast

JTB Tours have introduced an eco-friendly, fun and inexpensive way for visitors to explore the Gold Coast with their new Eco-Bikes. The bikes are powered by a 250w, rechargeable motor which can travel at a maximum speed of 25kmh. They have throttle and pedelec system allowing the rider to rely entirely on the motor for propulsion or they can pedal at the same time as the motor helps them along. The six gear bikes will travel up to 40km on a single battery depending on the terrain and how much the rider pedals. The bikes can be hired for two, four or eight hours and riders must be 13 years old or over. A helmet, bike lock, map of the 40km of bike pathways on the Gold Coast Oceanway, road rules and user manual are included in the hire. Bookings are essential and there are currently 40 eco-bikes in the fleet. www.jtb.com.au
